Timeline: 1043 BC - 586 BC

Symbol: Crown: represents 3 different kingdoms - united, Northern (Israel), Southern (Judah)

Timeline of Events

Samuel leads Israel Saul's reign - (David in Saul's court, David & Goliath) 1025-1005 BC David's reign - (Messianic covenant, expands kingdom, Bathsheba, Absalom) 1005-968 BC Solomon's reign - (best and worst of Israel) 968-928 BC Rehoboam splits nation - 928 BC

Divided Kingdom

Northern: Israel (928 - 722 BC) (Assyrians) Samaria is capital Built golden calves, intermarried with other nations

Southern: Judah (928 - 586 BC) (Babylonians) Jerusalem, Temple Inconsistent kings - some good, some bad

Interpretive Issues

Israel (Northern Kingdom): 0 for 20 good kings Judah (Southern Kingdom): 8 for 20 good kings

Prophetic Books

span multiple eras, not always chronological, highly contextualized.

Repent of judgment

Judgment is coming, live as my people
